2025056	The CAA considers implementing a discrete conspicuity SSR code for gliders.	The CAA is not convinced that a separate discrete squawk would in itself encourage those who are minded to switch off their transponders to do otherwise. Therefore, the CAA will not be implementing this recommendation.		
2025065	The CAA considers publishing a list of established drone training locations in the UK AIP.	This recommendation will be considered as part of a wider program of work concerning 'information airspace' within the UK AIP and as part of the overall Airspace Modernisation Strategy.		
2025099	Lasham Gliding Club considers introducing a start-of-day transponder check by which the serviceability of equipped tugs' transponders can be verified.	Introducing additional 'head-in-cockpit' tasks, such as proceduralised start-of-day or per-sortie transponder checks beyond existing standard practices, risks diverting attention from critical duties. The Recommendation does not fully address the principal failure mode identified in a System Safety Assessment of Transponder Serviceability, specifically, the transponder being left off during one of many rapid restarts. A single start-of-day check would not mitigate this risk in practice, as the opportunity for omission occurs repeatedly throughout the operating day rather than at its commencement.		
2025099	The BGA considers issuing guidance to clubs regarding the verification of the serviceability of tug aircraft SSR transponders.	An email has been sent from the BGA to Club Tugmasters in which they were reminded about methods of verification of tug transponder's serviceability, and also reminded of the requirement, under (UK)SERA.13001, to operate the transponder in all modes.		
2025126	Sherburn Aero Club remove the expired AIC Y 083/2023 from their website and ensure the RNP Instrument Approach Procedures 'Pilot Brief' and 'RNP Pilot Crib Sheet' are consistent.	The RNP Pilot crib sheet and AIC Y 083/2023 have been removed from the Sherburn Aero Club website.		
2025153	In the CAA review of CAP413, consideration be given to the wording at paragraph 4.165 to permit a response to transmissions on unattended aerodrome frequencies.	Under Consideration.		
2025205	The CAA to review the remarks for the Oxford AIAA within the UK AIP ENR 5.2 with regard to advising pilots of possible alternative radar service providers when operating within the AIAA.	Under Consideration.
